

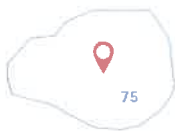
# Paris Administrative Tribunal

“ 2022 has been marked by a steady and high number of applications as well as by a rise of the Tribunal's decision output. For the first time in six years, the Tribunal's coverage rate became positive. The average time period before a decision is issued has decreased for the third consecutive year.

Urgent applications still hold an important place, with close to 5 000 applications, relating to increasingly complex and sensitive topics: expulsions of foreigners accused of religious radicalism, policing of political demonstrations, emergency housing, violations of freedom of trade and industry.



The Tribunal has been especially concerned with cases pertaining to environmental protection, regarding noise and light pollutions, banning social events causing animal stress at the Paris Aquarium, or classifying glitter and plastic blocs as litter.

Finally, this year has been particularly focused on external partnerships, with the Tribunal's participation in evening legal conferences (Nuit du droit), heritage events (Journées du patrimoine), as well as the hosting of public figures by our tax law and "Law and Literature" clubs. The Tribunal has welcomed schoolchildren from Paris and Créteil, and students from Sciences Po, Polytechnique, several universities, as well as judges and foreign delegations from Cameroun, Uzbekistan, Poland and Tunisia.
